### **The members of Lead-Free NJ collaborative request that the State of New Jersey allocate \$600 million from its American Rescue Plan funds to remediate lead in homes, replace lead service lines, and educate residents.**

- **\$300 million** for whole home remediation, focusing on **lead-based paint**, interior plumbing, and soil remediation in low-to-moderate-income housing.  
This funding will help fund the removal of lead-paint from homes and grow New Jersey's lead and healthy homes workforce, opening career pathways for residents in communities most impacted by poor housing quality.
- **\$300 million** for lead service line (LSL) replacement, with priority for low-income communities with a large number of LSLs.  
This includes funds dedicated to improving drinking water quality in state-regulated child care facilities, communications, training, and remediation plans.  
A portion of these funds will be dedicated to education and outreach to residents.
